◆ Ensuring that ALL their possessions, especially jumpers and PE kit are named and easily identifiable.

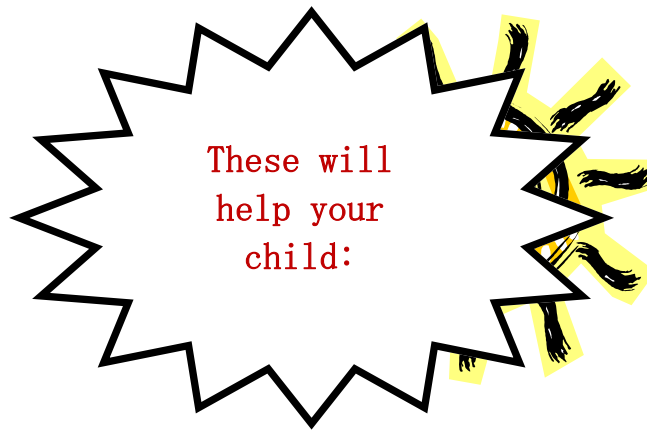
◆ Encouraging your child's growing independence - letting them sort out their own reading folder, coat, shoes etc.
