Early morning work- There will be a learning tasks on the interactive whiteboard for your child to complete while Miss Hargreaves takes the register.

Home Learning - You will have weekly spellings to learn, books to read, a maths activity and a SPAG/English activity to complete. Home learning will go home on a Wednesday and must be returned by the following Tuesday.

Dear Parents

We want to make the transition as easy as possible for your child.

You can help them by:

- ◆ Ensuring that ALL their possessions, especially jumpers and PE kit are named and easily identifiable.
- ◆ Encouraging your child's growing independence - letting them sort out their own reading folder, coat, shoes etc.
- ◆ Listening to them read, or ask them about their books and encourage them to read **as often as possible**.



◆ Practising mathematical skills in a friendly and informal way - number games, mental arithmetic and table facts.

◆ Encouraging and supporting them to do their weekly home learning by themselves.

- ◆ Helping your child to learn their weekly spellings.



Try to do these in the holidays



- ◆ **Keep a holiday diary with pictures.**
- ◆ **Write a postcard or letter to someone.**
- ◆ **Read books from the library.**
- ◆ **Practise any writing.**
- ◆ **Learn 2, 3, 5 & 10 times tables.**
- ◆ **Practise bonds to 10 & 20.**
- ◆ **Make something at home using measuring scales.**
