### What we will learn in Year

#### English

- Writing narratives
- Letter writing
- Non-chronological reports
- Instruction writing



#### Maths

- Add and subtract whole numbers with more than 4 digits.
- Short multiplication and division
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators.
- Identify factors and multiples.



#### In Year 5 you will be expected to:

- ◆ Keep to the classroom rules.
- ◆ Show the school values at all times.
- ◆ Be responsible for your own equipment and PE kit.
- ◆ Complete your home learning tasks, which include learning spellings and reading regularly at home.
